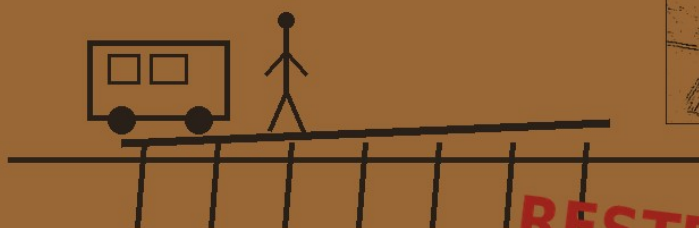

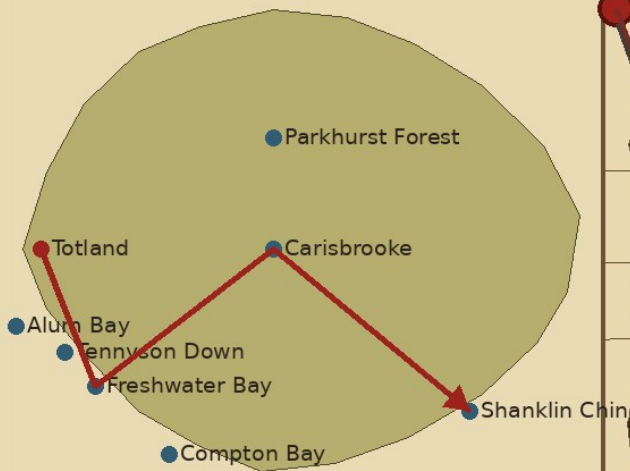

ISLE OF WIGHT - ADVENTURE ROUTES



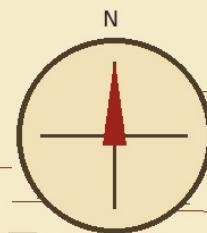
WEST WIGHT - ZOOMED INVESTIGATION MAP



LOCATION NOTES

Totland lies at the far western end of the Isle of Wight. The bay, pier, Tennyson Down, Alum Bay and Freshwater Bay all sit within the Titan's alleged roaming area.

Most sightings are reported at dawn, dusk or after rain, when muddy ground records unusually large prints. Routes towards Freshwater Bay, Compton Bay and the high ground of Tennyson Down appear repeatedly in witness accounts.

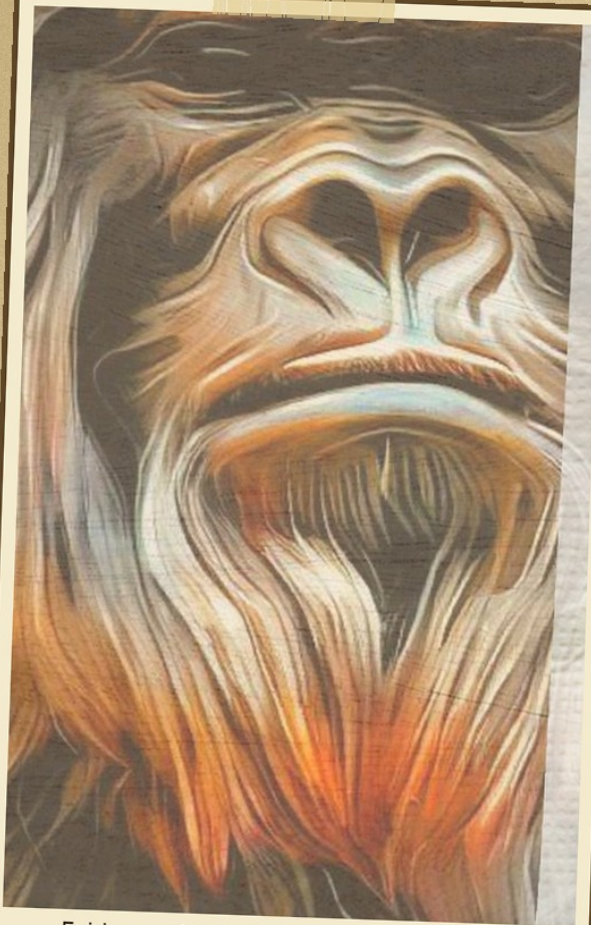


COMPASS FOUND

Iris the Pegasus

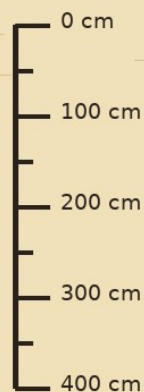
FOOTPRINT SCALE COMPARISON

THE GUARDIAN OF TOTLAND

Totland is a quiet village of sea views, old lanes and green slopes. Yet local stories insist that the hills are not empty. A giant figure, wrapped in thick fur, is said to patrol the cliffs and woodland paths.

People call him the Totland Titan. Some believe he protects the land, keeping careless visitors away from fragile places and watching over the gardens, woods and shoreline. Fishermen describe huge prints near the pier. Walkers report the smell of rain-soaked fur. Photographs, rather inconveniently, are nearly always blurred.

REPORTED CLUES

MUDDY PRINTS

Often found after rain.



WET FUR SMELL

Reported near the sea wall.



BROKEN TWIGS

Usually above head height.



GOOD FORTUNE

Gardens seem to thrive after sightings.





A MORNING ABOVE WEST WIGHT

Bigfoot's closest companion is Iris, a Pegasus with silver-gold wings and a talent for appearing exactly when an adventure is required. One clear morning, Iris arrived with news of a hidden cave near Freshwater Bay.

Bigfoot climbed aboard, gripping firmly while Iris lifted them above the fields. Below, Totland Bay curved around the coast. Tennyson Down rose to the south, and the Needles stood beyond Alum Bay like stone teeth in the sea.

The cave entrance was narrow, but enormous prints led towards it. Inside they found old shells, a weathered compass and markings scratched into the rock. Were they left by sailors, smugglers or another creature? Bigfoot gave a thoughtful grunt. Iris suggested they investigate before lunch.

TOTLAND PIER

The Titan returned before dawn. By breakfast, the only evidence was a wet footprint and a bent railing.

PERSONAL EFFECTS

HEAVY BOOTS

Useful on cliffs, in woods and when stepping over puddles.

LOUD T-SHIRTS

Usually decorated with imaginary bands and lightning bolts.

PUB MANNERS

Friendly, quiet and inclined to order the largest packet of crisps.

CAMERA HABIT

Appears immediately after the lens has fogged or the photographer sneezes.

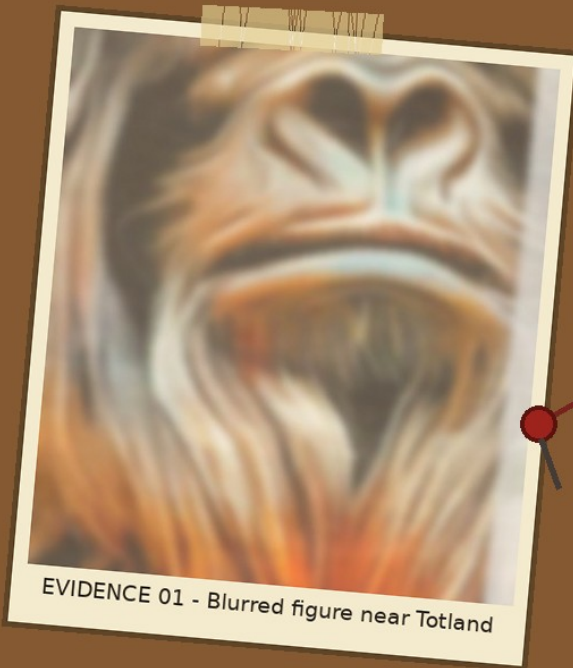
PEGASUS SUPPLIES

Golden apples, meadow hay and a blanket for late-night films.

A creature eight feet tall wearing a heavy-metal shirt should be easy to spot. Yet all reliable witnesses seem to be looking the other way at precisely the wrong moment. This is either remarkable stealth or very poor timing.



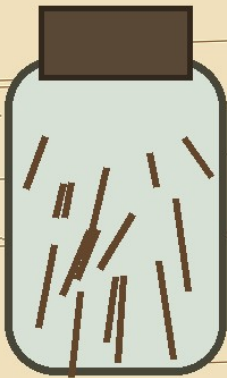
